Program Notes

Nänie

German composer Johannes Brahms was 48 years old when he composed Nänie. Based on a text by Schiller, the title refers to a Roman funeral song. Encouraged by a friend who wanted a him to write a choral piece appropriate for a funeral, he wrote Nänie in memory of his friend, Anselm Feuerbach, a painter.

Even the beautiful must die
That which subdues mortals and gods
does not touch the unyielding heart
of the Stygian Zeus.

Only once did love soften the Rule of the Shades, and yet, at the threshold, sternly he recalled his gift.

Aphrodite does not soothe the wounds of the beautiful boy whose delicate body the boar had cruelly torn.

The immortal mother does not rescue the divine hero, when, at the Scaen gate, falling, he fulfills his destiny.

> But she rises out of the sea with all daughters of Nereus, and begins the lament for her glorified son.

Behold, the gods weep, all the goddesses weep, because the beautiful perishes, the perfect dies.

Even to be a lament on the lips of a loved one is glorious, for the common ones goes down to Orcus unsung.

Mass in Time of War

When Haydn wrote Mass in Time of War in 1796, Austria and France had been at war almost continuously since the French Revolution. A peace accord was falling apart, and Austria was being forced to mobilize its troops once again. Because of the extensive use of tympani the subtitle of the mass is "Paukenmesse (Kettledrum Mass)." Although we are not using tympani tonight, you will be able to hear them in the piano in the first part of the Agnus Dei. Also, near the end of the work you may detect the trumpets calling the troops to battle.
